

Monsoon rains and flash flooding in 2022 caused some of the worst flooding in Pakistan's history: over 1700 people died and 2.1 million were left homeless. Your donations supported Pakistani people through the provision of food packs, hot meals, medical camps, and shelter tents. The second phase of this project is currently underway, and supports the construction of 20 flood-resistant homes for vulnerable families.


### SOMALIA: FOOD PACK DISTRIBUTIONS BELEDWEYNE

#### HAND PUMPS AND DEEP WELLS

According to the World Health Organization, 1 in 3 people around the world do not have access to safe drinking water. Contaminated water can cause diseases like cholera, diarrhea, hepatitis A, and polio. Our Thirst Relief programs provide safe drinking water to enable entire communities to drink, wash, and clean, as well as irrigate their crops and hydrate their animals. This leads to healthier lives and provides many with a route out of poverty.

### W.A.S.H. WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE

Lack of access to safe water and sanitation can lead to the spread of diseases, which can have severe consequences for communities, particularly in areas with limited healthcare resources. Penny Appeal USA prioritizes WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) projects in underserved areas because access to clean water, proper sanitation facilities, and good hygiene practices are critical to the health and well-being of individuals and communities. By prioritizing WASH, Penny Appeal is working to improve people's health and quality of life in targeted areas and address a pressing global challenge.



The festival is observed through the sacrifice of animals, known as Qurbani, to honor the willingness of Prophet Ibrahim (AS) to sacrifice his son, Ismail (AS). Muslims are expected to sacrifice a healthy sheep, goat, buffalo, or camel during the holy Islamic month of Dhul-Hijjah and distribute the meat to feed those in need.
