Letter from our CEO

Asalamu Alaykum wa Rahmatullah, Peace be Upon You.

If time is a journey, 2023 was a bumpy ride.

At Penny Appeal USA, we're committed to stopping poverty in its tracks. That typically means we focus on big-picture projects that empower communities to sustainably secure food, water, and shelter, such as our solar-paneled water centers. However, when a devastating series of earthquakes struck Turkey and Syria last February, or when earthquakes ravaged Morocco and floods devastated Libya in the fall, hope for the future was eclipsed by the urgent needs of today, and we responded. With your support, we sent urgently needed medicine, tents, packaged foods, and purified water to families who had lost everything, saving countless lives in the process. But, critically, our support didn't stop there: in keeping with our focus on sustainable aid, we remained in the region long after it had faded from the headlines, rebuilding infrastructure such as homes, schools, and medical clinics. We know that the need won't stop when the media's attention dies down, but fortunately, neither do we.


On the heels of these calamities, your support provided so much to so many, including transforming the lives of over 160,000 beneficiaries through Ramadan food packs and Qurbani/Udhiyyah. Each of these statistics moves beyond numbers, representing a child's belly full after a long day, or a renewed sense of hope for a family that had been struggling to find clean water. Your gifts have even gone further: when you sent live, pregnant goats to communities in need to supplement your Qurbani donations, you fed families not just for a few days, but for an entire year by providing them with milk, cheese, and a sustainable source of income.

Today, we're all still reeling from the current humanitarian crisis in Gaza, to which Penny Appeal USA immediately responded. We've proudly been working in Palestine since our inception in 2015, with projects such as rooftop vegetable gardens, olive tree groves, and vocational training all focused on building up the capacity of the civilian population.

No matter the challenge, we know that we can tackle it, together.

Türkiye-Syria Earthquake Response

Türkiye: Hatay Province Syria: Communities of Harim, Salqin, and Azmarin

A 7.8-magnitude earthquake hit Türkiye and Syria on February 6th, resulting in the deaths of nearly 60,000 people and over \$160 billion in infrastructure damage. Your donations provided food, blankets, and hygiene kits to earthquake-affected communities in Southern Türkiye and Northwest Syria.

Jenin Emergency

Jenin, West Bank

A large-scale military offensive in Jenin took place in July of 2023, causing the deaths of 13 Palestinians, 143 injuries, and the displacement of 3500 people. This response provided affected families with blankets, pillows, mattresses, water tanks, and medical supplies for local hospitals.

Gaza

The people of Gaza have been struck by tragic attacks. Nearly 90% of Gaza's population—1.9 million people—have been displaced, and have borne witness to unprecedented destruction, chaos, trauma, and an unimaginable death toll. Hundreds of thousands of people in Gaza have been forced out of their homes without clothes, food, or shelter. Approximately onefifth of Gaza's buildings lay in ruins or have suffered severe damage, exacerbating an already devastating humanitarian crisis.

Yemen Food and Vegetable Gardens

Ma'rib Governorate

More than half of Yemeni people live below the poverty line and cannot meet their daily nutritional needs. Your donations helped provide vulnerable families with monthly food baskets, along with resources and training to help them establish home vegetable gardens.

South Africa School Breakfast Club and Gardens

JANUARY-DECEMBER 2023

Cape Town, Johannesburg, and Durban

Poverty in some parts of South Africa has resulted in high levels of hunger among young people and high drop-out rates from school. This program helps mitigate this issue by providing elementary school students with their daily breakfast, as well as establishing vegetable gardens in 3 schools to help families learn to cultivate their own food.



Ramadan Distributions

With your support, Penny Appeal USA provides food packs and iftar meals to vulnerable families during the holy month of Ramadan. The food packs are designed and sourced in each country, and include items like dates, legumes, vegetables, rice, flour, juice, and other ingredients commonly used in local communities. In 2023, we provided over 7,000 food packs across 12 countries, feeding nearly 55,000 people.



Stories of Hope

The Anoun family resides in an environment surrounded by deserts in the Hadhramaut region of Yemen. Their living conditions are difficult, with makeshift shelters offering little protection against the harsh weather. They struggle to secure a steady income and fulfill their basic needs for a decent life.

Thanks to your generous donations, the Anoun family received a food basket that sustained them throughout the month of Ramadan. This basket, containing staples like bread, rice, legumes, and dates, brought them much-needed nourishment and happiness.

Barak Anoun expressed gratitude, stating, "This food has allowed us to experience our happiest moments. Our home was filled with joy and delight, something we haven't felt in a long time due to financial constraints."







Hand Pumps and Deep Wells

Bangladesh, Afghanistan, India, Pakistan, Somalia, and Malawi

With 2.2 billion lacking safe drinking water and 4.2 billion lacking sanitation services globally, constructing hand pumps and deep wells creates transformative change. Access to clean water improves people's physical and emotional well-being, relieving them from the significant distress they have endured by limited water access. It instills a sense of relief, hope, and renewed resilience, ultimately enhancing the community's overall quality of life.

W.A.S.H (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene)

Approximately half the global population lacks secure sanitation, posing health risks especially in areas with limited healthcare resources. Penny Appeal USA prioritizes WASH projects in under-served areas, recognizing the critical role of clean water, sanitation, and hygiene in the well-being of individuals and communities.

Solar Wells

Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Lebanon

These incredible feats of engineering not only provide running water to the homes of up to 1,500 people and 1,000 livestock but also supply electricity and power to schools and places of worship as well! Placed in desert areas, the Solar Water Panel & Power Centre can fill a reservoir that holds three days' worth of water to ensure they don't go without on those cloud-covered days.

Stories of Hope

Khateejan, a widow from Meghraj Veri, Pakistan, faced challenges after her husband's death. Left to support her two children, she utilized her handicraft skills to make ends meet. However, a major obstacle emerged – the village's distant water source consumed much of her time, hindering her work and her children's education.

To address this crisis, Penny Appeal USA built a solar-powered well in Meghraj Veri. This transformed Khateejan's life, providing easy access to clean water. With more time on her hands, she could focus on her crafts, improving her income, and her children could concentrate on their studies. Khateejan expressed gratitude to Penny Appeal USA and its donors for this life-changing intervention.





Zainab, a trained hairdresser, struggled with unstable income while renting a room in a shared house.

As a single mother and migrant, Zainab faced significant challenges, including times without food for her children. Penny Appeal USA's OrphanKind program provided crucial support, ensuring daily meals for the family and enabling Zainab to save money on essentials like utilities. The program also supported Yusuf's education by providing schoolwear, educational resources, and clothing, ensuring his equal opportunities. Zainab expresses deep gratitude for the program's transformative impact on their lives.

Yusuf's story, intertwined with Zainab's resilience, demonstrates how our OrphanKind program uplifts families like the Elongas, providing essential resources and support for a healthier, more stable life and a brighter future.







Palestine Livelihoods

Gaza

SEPTEMBER 2022-FEBRUARY 2023

This project aims to improve people's livelihoods in Gaza by empowering 38 vulnerable households to grow their own vegetables and breed their own sheep.

Gaza

OCTOBER 2022-MAY 2023

Many young Palestinians struggle to find employment despite their considerable talent and skills. This project empowered unemployed university graduates by supporting them with job coaching, internships, and technical training to expand their possibilities in the job market.

Lebanon Greenhouses

South and Mount Lebanon

JANUARY-FEBRUARY 2023 OCTOBER-NOVEMBER 2023

The agricultural sector in Lebanon has struggled under the country's financial crisis, with many farmers unable to purchase the necessary tools and inputs needed to grow food. As a result, plastic greenhouses have emerged as a viable way for families to grow and sell their own food. This project assisted vulnerable Lebanese and Palestinian families by helping them build a greenhouse and providing them with seeds, fertilizer, an irrigation system, and a small shop for selling produce in order to secure a livelihood for their families.

Palestine Olive Trees

Gaza

OCTOBER 2022-JANUARY 2023 SEPTEMBER 2023-JANUARY 2024

Olive farmers in Gaza face unique hardships including land confiscation, violence, detention, and economic blockades. This project has aimed to alleviate some of their hardships by providing them with resources and skills to support their olive cultivation.

Bangladesh Livestock

Char Islands, Northern districts of Bangladesh

OCTOBER 2022-SEPTEMBER 2023

This project enhanced sustainable livelihood opportunities for disadvantaged and vulnerable women living on hard-to-reach riverine islands in Bangladesh. Your donations helped improve these women's sovereignty and quality of life by providing them with goats, resources, and training in homestead farming and goat-rearing practices.

Afghanistan's economic crisis is widespread, and unemployment rates have skyrocketed over the last four years. To help address this critical issue, your donations are supporting vocational training for young people in Kabul who are interested in learning mobile phone repair or tailoring—two skills that are in high demand in local communities and will help increase household income for the beneficiaries.

ZAKAT AL-FITR

Florida, Georgia, Ilinois, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey North Carolina, Virginia

April 2023

Zakat al-Fitr, Fitrana or Fitrah, is a form of charity given to the poor at the end of Ramadan. It is paid by the head of the household for each member of the family, before Eid al-Fitr prayer. Zakat al-Fitr is about the price of one meal—estimated at \$10 in 2023. This year, we partnered with 15 organizations across the United States to help American families celebrate Eid with gifts, meals, and gift cards through your Zakat al-Fitr donations.

FIDYAH/KAFFARAH

While the majority of Muslims fast during Ramadan as an act of sacrifice and devotion, many people may not be able to participate in this sacred practice. In the event that one cannot fast, they give Fidyah or Kaffarah, a gift of nourishment to those in need.

Your Fidyah/Kaffarah donations are used to provide meals to people all over the world during the holy month of Ramadan. In 2023, these donations fed over 25,000 people.


QURBANI


APRIL 2023

Eid al-Adha is celebrated every year to commemorate the completion of Hajj, the annual Muslim pilgrimage to Mecca. The festival is observed through the sacrifice of animals, known as Qurbani, to honor the willingness of Prophet Ibrahim (AS) to sacrifice his son, Ismail (AS). Muslims are expected to sacrifice a healthy sheep, goat, buffalo, or camel during the holy Islamic month of Dhul-Hijjah and distribute the meat to feed those in need. The act symbolizes a Muslim's willingness to give up some of our own bounties in order to follow Allah's commands, strengthen ties of friendship and help those who are in need.

For Qurbani this year, we provided fresh meat to Muslim families across ten countries.

Baitul Hemayah DV Shelter

In 2019, we opened the only Muslim-led domestic violence shelter in the Carolinas, focused on providing culturally-sensitive care to all women, regardless of faith. In 2023, the shelter was a refuge for 51 brave survivors. We assisted them with finding jobs, housing, financial resources, and counseling, in addition to providing them with shelter, 3 meals a day, bus cards for medical appointments and job interviews, and clothing for their young children.

My experience at the shelter has been one of recovery and rehabilitation. I wasn't as scared because this was more like a home. You only have one life. How you live, or choose to live, that life is up to you."

"This is a 24-hour, 7-day-a-week shelter. It's not just a shelter. It's actually a program for women who are abused. This is not a place where it's just a gymnasium and you have about 15 beds in a room. For me, that's too much. You're not able to personalize the skills that you have to help them because there's so many women. This place means that I'm able to be their friend but I'm also able to help the women get ten steps farther than when they got here. You want to be able to work one-on-one with them so you can see how they're going to blossom. We have a very good success rate when it comes to the women we support. It's small, it's personable, and that's the way I like it.

When they walk through the door, they always say to me, "I didn't think it was going to look like this."

Not everybody can deal with being somewhere away from home. So we make sure that they are seeing the therapist at least once a week so that when they leave they have some tools to work with when they're gone from the shelter.

I wish that we would be able to get more women that are abused to realize that we are here for them and that we can help them. We have a good program here, we have good employees, good advocates, and sometimes it can get a little scary but it takes funding for us to continue to do this great work that we do."



REFLECTIONS FROM THE FIELD



I left a piece of my heart in South Africa. I left a piece with Amina, mother of Meriem, who puts her heart and soul into caring for her daughters, yet still feels like she isn't doing enough. I left a piece with Slindile, mother of Gugulethu, who watches her son play soccer and dreams of a brighter future for him. I left a piece with Sophie, mother of Layla, who cares not only for her children but her sister's children and finally through our assistance, has a home of her own. When I reflect on my time in South Africa, I think of each of these women and the guardians we met. I feel their love and boundless efforts to protect their families in a place where violence is around every corner.

These women welcomed us into their lives and shared their stories of grief and gratitude. Through the hardships of gang violence, unemployment, food insecurity, and unemployment, they continue to protect and nurture their children. They continue to glow when telling tales of how Gugulethu goofs around or how Meriem chases butterflies.

During my time in South Africa, more than anything I felt the power of a mother's love. How they dream of seeing their children grow beyond their dreams. How each day is consumed by the question of how will they protect them? How can their children's lives one day be easier than theirs? More than anything, I felt their faith in their children. Their love permeated so deeply. I left myself with them. I carry their faith and a promise for their children's future so that they don't have to carry these fears alone.


